The trustees, who are also the directors of the charitable company, present their annual report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019.

The Charity is commonly known as OutdoorLads.

STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Board of Trustees is drawn from the membership and reports to the Annual General Meeting of OutdoorLads. All the Trustees are unpaid volunteers.

The Board has overall responsibility for the work of OutdoorLads, in particular, setting strategy, direction, and targets. The Board of Trustees delegates day-to-day management of the organisation to three staff. Events are managed by appointed volunteer leaders. Leaders are managed on a regional basis by Regional Coordinators, appointed by the Board of Trustees.

Governing Document

The Charity, which is also a company limited by guarantee, is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 1 October 2008.

Appointment of Directors and Trustees

The Board of Trustees has nine members at 31 March 2019, of these, four are office bearers; Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary. The Board is authorised to co-opt two further Trustees. Appointments are for a term of three years subject to ratification by the membership at the following AGM to the co-option. If required, Trustees receive external training in accordance with guidelines set down by the National Council for Voluntary Organisations.

Risk management

The Board have identified the major risks, both financial and other, facing the charity and have taken the appropriate action to mitigate those risks.

Volunteers

Volunteers continue to make an invaluable contribution towards the life and work of OutdoorLads and support a wide range of activities behind the scenes, as well as face-to-face with members. All OutdoorLads activities are still run by volunteers with the exception of some specialist sports where OutdoorLads does not have the required equipment/insurance/in-house trained manpower to run the event.

The number of volunteers in the year was 262. This figure is drop from the figure reported last year due to a data cleaning exercise in which inactive leaders were removed from the figures. Recruiting and retaining leaders is crucial to the success of the group and numbers continue to see strong growth, with one Trustee specifically responsible for supporting our volunteers.

Related party transactions

Details of related party transactions are set out in note 21 to the financial statements. The Trustees participate in the activities of OutdoorLads on the same terms and conditions as other members.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity's objectives are:

"To promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of the UK, in particular but not exclusively, gay, bisexual, transsexual and transgender communities, without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race, political, religious or other opinions, by associating together the residents of the area of benefit, the local and the public authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants. To promote equality and diversity and to eliminate discrimination in relation to gay, bisexual, transsexual, and transgender persons by advancing education and raising awareness of issues affecting said persons."

Compared to the previous year's survey results, the proportion of people who felt less isolated rose by 7 percentage points the proportion and those who felt more positive about the future rose by 6 percentage points. Other responses remained statistically in line.

ACTIVITIES IN THE YEAR 2018/2019:

This year saw the launch of a new website for OutdoorLads. As well as creating an improved experience for endusers, the new site improves the day-to-day workflow for OutdoorLads' staff, making their job of running the charity much easier. The new website successfully does the following:

- An effective interface on mobile devices
- Offers a full e-commerce system for managing and selling events
- Sells tickets to some events, but offers free bookings for others
- Sells tickets to a 'waiting list' once the event is full
- Promotes 'waitlisted' users to the event when cancellations take place
- Makes it easy to refund waitlisted users that don't make it into the attendee list
- Gives leaders the option to 'clone' existing events rather than creating them from scratch every time
- Sells Memberships online, and manages multiple levels of membership with various privileges at each level
- Provides a 'loyalty' scheme to volunteer leaders, where certain actions are rewarded by points, which can be exchanged in full or part payment of future events
- Offers a flexible system for discounts and voucher codes at checkout

- Provides an in-site messaging system to communicate important information to members or attendees, and allowing peer-to-peer messaging
- Provides effective reporting on membership and attendees

The year saw OutdoorLads deliver its widest ever range of free and paid-for events both in the UK and abroad. These events provide opportunities for members to try new activities, learn new skills, make new friends and improve their fitness and wellbeing.

At the end of the year the number of Full Members were 1,730 with 7,941 Pay As You Go members and 184 concession members. This appears to show on fall from the previous year but this is due to a data cleansing exercise that removed a number of duplicate accounts.

The charity ran over 1,491 events during the year (1,321 in 2018), of which the following number of primary activities took place:

While we were disappointed to see no growth in several categories, Climbing and Biking showed significant growth for another year. Bouldering in particular continues to be a great entry activity bringing lots of new members to the group.

The Board continued to focus on protecting the financial stability of the charity and its operations whilst keeping membership and event costs as low as possible.

Key activities planned for the year 2019/20

- The website is the 'engine' of OutdoorLads and we are committed to continuing to deliver new features and improvements on an ongoing basis.
- We will create a Five Year Plan based on a strategic review.
- We will continue to grow our volunteer leadership pool and improve training available for leaders including training in the area of mental health awareness and support.
- We are examining ways to reduce the environmental impact of our events and general operation.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Overview

- The charity had net expenditure of £13,325 (2018: net income of £11,034 after a prior period error was identified (see note 22)). Cash flow was negative at £77,435 (2018: cash outflow of £19,265).
- At the end of the financial year net current assets were £75,506 (2018: £95,470).
- Membership income continued to grow in line with expectations.
- Event income grew by almost 10% and our margin has also improved.

- The Trustees continued to focus on the costs of running the charity (overheads) but overheads increased significantly to £187,002 (2018: £106,429). Much of this increase is down to additional costs spent on staff, rent and regular website maintenance and functional improvements. There is also a one off (non-cash) charge relating to the write off of old website costs of £28k.
- During the financial year beginning April 2019 the Trustees took the following actions to improve our financial position:
 - Increased the price of membership for the first time in six years, in-line with inflation.
 - o Increased the number of hostel and camping events that contribute cash.
 - Confirmed a major New Year event.
 - Reduced rent by moving to cheaper offices.

The charity continues to offer value for money to its members with 90% of paid members surveyed thinking events provided *fair/reasonable, good,* or *very good* value for money. 84% of paid members agreed that the membership fee *provided fair/reasonable, good,* or *very good* value for money. These figures are statistically in line with the previous year.

Reserves Policy

The charity needs reserves to manage its cash flow, to invest in future equipment purchases, respond to unforeseen circumstances and to provide stability to the charity's operations.

At the year-end, the Charity had free reserves of $\pounds 66,158$ (2018: $\pounds 84,950$). The Trustees estimate reserves of $\pounds 70,000$ are needed. It should be noted that for the last two years the charity has been able to fund significant investment in a new website from existing reserves.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

In setting our objectives, carrying out our activities for the year and looking further ahead, the Board have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including guidance on public benefit and feecharging. The Charity relies on income from fees and charges to cover its operating costs. In setting the level of fees, charges, and concessions, the Board give careful consideration to the accessibility of those on low incomes.

On top of the health and wellbeing benefit of the charity's events our pricing structure, including Concession Membership, is designed to make the events affordable to as wide a range of participants as possible. In addition, the OutdoorLads Foundation provides financial support to those who may still be unable to afford membership or participation in our paid events. A total of £3,267 was used to support 23 individuals with direct financial support to attend events. During the year a number of measures were taken to encourage more people to benefit from Foundation funding.

During the year funding from the Ocean Youth Trust charity enabled the Foundation to offer a number of places on a week-long trip on a tall ship, and a contribution of $\pounds 1,500$ made by the Geoff Herrington Foundation will be spent to encourage people under 25 to take up training and/or join our events.

1. Company Information

OutdoorLads Ltd is a private company limited by guarantee, incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act. The address of the registered office is given on page 1 of the financial statements. The nature of the Company's operations and its principal activity is the advancement of health through outdoor activities. The Company is a registered charity, registered in England and Wales (registered number 1133121).

2. Statement of Compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, significant judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Basis of Accounting

OutdoorLads Ltd meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going Concern

The Board are confident that the Charity will remain in a positive cash position for the 12 months following the approval of the financial statements. On this basis, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

Income

Membership, events income and donations are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) in the period to which they relate. Monies received in advance are deferred and included within creditors until the period to which they relate. Income is recognised when the Charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

3. Accounting Policies (continued)

Donated Services and Facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, and conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), the general volunteer time is not recognised.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised in expenditure in the period of receipt.

Investment Income

Investment income is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Intangible Fixed Assets

Intangible assets are initially recorded at cost and are subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses. Assets costing less than £300 are not capitalised but written off to revenue in the year of acquisition.

Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Website	- over 7 years (from date new site goes live) straight line
Software licences	- 33.3% straight line

Tangible Fixed Assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Assets costing less than £300 are not capitalised but written off to revenue in the year of acquisition.

3. Accounting policies *(continued)*

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures & fittings	- 15% straight line
Motor vehicles	- 25% straight line

Stock

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost includes all costs of purchase, costs of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the stock to its present location and condition.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the charity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

Financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost are reviewed for objective evidence of impairment at the end of each reporting date. If there is objective evidence of impairment, an impairment loss is recognised under the appropriate heading in the statement of financial activities in which the initial gain was recognised.

Any reversals of impairment are recognised immediately, to the extent that the reversal does not result in a carrying amount of the financial asset that exceeds what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised.

4. Limited by Guarantee

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and does not have a share capital. In the event of the charity being wound up, the members are committed to contributing a sum not exceeding ± 10 each.

21. Related Party Transactions

The charity has contracted services from Linten Technologies Ltd. This company is providing domain renewal and server hosting services. Two Trustees, Daniel Burford and Steven Allan, are directors in this company.

During the year the value of services and goods purchased from Linten Technologies Ltd was $\pounds 18,313$ (2018: $\pounds 6,374$). The amount outstanding at the balance sheet date was $\pounds 3$ (2018: $\pounds nil$).

Neither Daniel Burford nor Steven Allen play any role in the Board's decision to use Linten Technologies Ltd. Additionally, OutdoorLads Ltd carries out regular market testing to ensure that the services are being provided at a competitive market rate.

The trustees participate in the events provided by OutdoorLads Ltd on the same terms and conditions as all other members.

Those trustees who are also event leaders may claim expenses on the same basis as other leaders. Any amounts claimed are in addition to the trustees' expenses shown in note 9.
